K-2 Class



They really enjoyed our hovercraft experiment that showed how friction and movement work together. We will continue our next unit this month that will cover rocks, soil, water, and magnets.

3-8 Language Arts

November was a month for sharing! CTL students used their creativity to share their favorite books for the trimester with their peers through book projects. In writing, they shared their favorite personal memoir in their portfolios. They eagerly shared representations of their learning with their families at Portfolio Preview.

Even though we all enjoyed the week off to celebrate Thanksgiving with our













families, we're all happy to be back at school this week and have enjoyed hearing about the numerous books students read over the break, as well as the stories they wrote.

This week we are getting back into our reading and writing workshops. Students will continue to read books and share recommendations with their classmates. We will continue to model reading strategies and story elements through our read aloud books and through individual conferences. And through mini-lessons and individual conferences, we will teach strategies to move

students forward in their development as writers, focusing on elements that improve writing such as mechanics and grabbing the reader's attention.

In grades 3-5 during writing workshop, students will be preparing for their first Author Celebration of the year that will take place the week before Christmas break. They will share their published stories with the class and celebrate the creativity and hard work that moved them through the writing process to publication. Students in grades 6-8 have already completed their first published piece and Author Celebration and are currently working on their next pieces of writing.

3-8 Math/Science

I am excited to share with you that Pam Blakeslee is joining our class during the 3-5 grade math time! Mrs. Blakeslee comes with a wealth of knowledge about teaching and math. She jumped right in last week and is already





helping me make sure we are meeting the diverse needs of our students. We are excited to have her joining our staff!

In science, the 3-5 graders have been studying the properties of soil. We have been learning how









to identify types of soil and will be testing properties such as how much water they retain and how well they support plant life. The 6-8 graders have been studying force, motion, and energy. Most recently, we have been conducting experiments related to Newton's 3 laws of motion.









In math, the 3-5 graders are currently focusing on multiplication and division. Some of the strategies they learn may be unfamiliar to you because most of us were not taught these same strategies. However, the strategies we learn are intended to build better number sense, develop stronger mental math skills, and provide better mathematical

understanding when we get to the traditional algorithms with which you and I are most familiar. The 6-8 graders are finishing our focus on ratios and will begin a unit on measurement concepts this week.
